### A word from Holy Cross Hospital CEO

It has been 6 months since taking up the role as CEO and I am delighted to share with you a little about me and my reflections of Holy Cross Hospital.

I have worked mainly for large organisations and at an executive level have held local, pan London, regional and national roles. I have enjoyed the diversity, challenges and success each have delivered. I enjoy nothing better than to lead transformational change however always in the context of maintaining the fundamentals of an ethos of patient first, compassion and continuous quality improvement.

Some 30 years ago I spent one weekend at Holy Cross Hospital and had an opportunity to experience at first hand the Sisters' ministry and ambition. Whilst unexpected the fortuitous timing of this role afforded me the opportunity to be part of an organisation that values human life and validates individuals regardless of their medical condition or disability. Why would I not pursue such an opportunity.

More recently you have made a marvellous contribution to our inpatient therapy equipment:

# The THERA-Trainer fall-safe dynamic standing frame and the THERA-Tigo motor-assisted cycling trainer.

We are delighted to have shared with the local community the Friends recent rehabilitation equipment acquisition. The balance training system and a stationary cycling trainer is already in use and supporting improved outcomes for our patients in the following ways:

• The THERA-Trainer is a fall-safe, dynamic standing frame for postural control and balance training. It is suitable for people who have difficulty standing as it helps strengthen the core and improve the patient's alignment in preparation for them relearning how to walk.

• The THERA-Tigo is a motor-assisted cycling trainer for passive, assisted and active cycling and can be used from the comfort of a chair or wheelchair. Our physiotherapists adjust the settings so that the patient can receive a minimal amount of assistance or be challenged to power through a controlled level of resistance.

The Tigo's inbuilt technology generates a report to show the patient's emerging functionality and how much activity was achieved, therefore providing that much needed encouragement.

In late April, Chairman of the Friends Torquil Sligo-Young joined the Chief Executive Officer, Frances Campion-Smith and our physiotherapists, Ray Milay and Aakriti Shrestha. Having met in the inpatient physiotherapy gym, both pieces of equipment

were demonstrated by Sister Caroline who is currently an in-patient at Holy Cross Hospital.

Sister Caroline told the team how she likes using the cycling trainer which introduces an element of fun as

well as work. This is particularly the case when using the cycle with some resistance.

Ray Milay our IP physio lead joined Frances in communicating their gratitude to the Hospital Friends for their generous donation. Ray impressed on how the equipment represents a significant advancement in the team's ability to provide rehabilitation care to our patients and allows them to achieve their recovery goals more effectively and efficiently.
